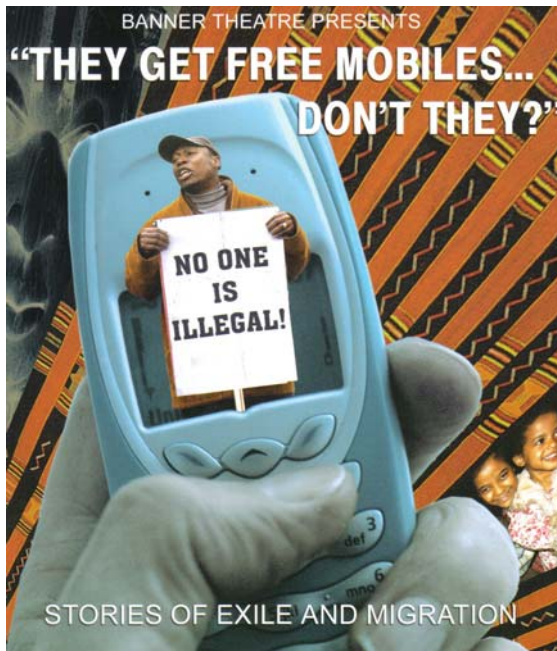


BANNER THEATRE presents "They get free mobiles ... don't they?"
